- Presentation of the following proposed rules:
  - 1. Chemicals of High Concern in Children's Products Rule, Agency of Human Services, Department of Health
    - a. This proposal refines the requirements for the disclosure and reporting of toxic substances that are intentionally added to a children's products. This rule also amends the list of Chemicals of High Concern to Children by adding 20 chemicals that must be reported by manufacturers of children's products. There are also 'housekeeping' emendations that provide clarity.
  - 2. The Board of Health Hearing Rule, Agency of Human Services, Department of Health
    - a. This rule governs how the Board of Health conducts hearings, laying out appellants' rights and responsibilities and providing a transparent, clear process for Board hearings.
  - 3. Groundwater Protection Rule and Strategy, Agency of Natural Resources
    - a. The Groundwater Protection Rule and Strategy was last comprehensively updated in 2005. This rule amendment incorporates the legislative directive that became effective in 2008 making groundwater resources in the State held in trust for the public and creates standardized requirements for ensuring activities permitted by the Agency of Natural Resources will not adversely affect public trust uses of groundwater, including use for drinking water. The amendment also updates the list of Groundwater Enforcement Standards to reflect current numeric guidelines generated by the Vermont Department of Health and clarifies the process for reclassifying groundwater.
